This formidable task ensured the preservation of the structure. 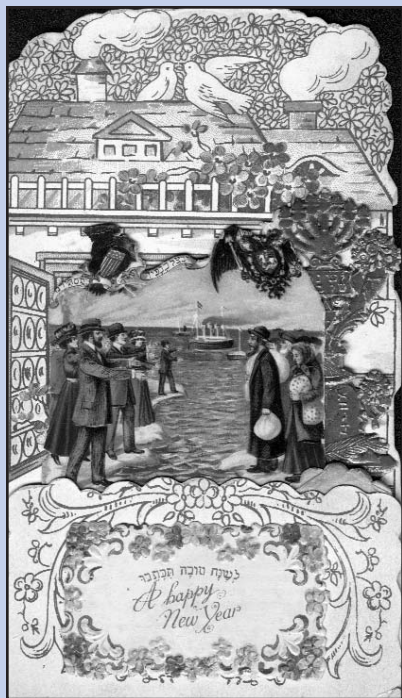

been extended through July 4, 2006.



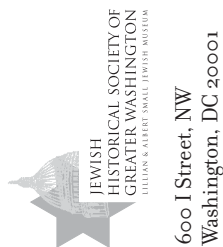
